"Duty Before Pleasure" may have been the motive that inspired Mrs. Earl A. Miles to join the Torrance Red Cross Canteen service in 1942, but she has seen Duty AND Pleasure march happily hand in hand down the years from then to now, bringing this active bright-eyed lady rich rewards in enjoyable experience and lasting friendship, as well as the satisfaction of work well worth while.

Mrs. Miles, mother of three, and grandmother of seven, has been a Torrance resident since 1917, when she came from her native Illinois with her husband, who is now employed at the Douglas Aircraft plant in Long Beach. She joined the local Red Cross Canteen shortly after its inception, and has never found that its duties interfered "for a moment" with her activities as a member of the Woman's club, a popular bridge player, or a devoted "grandma." Indeed, Mrs. Miles claims her grandchildren as her really important hobby.

Among the many friends Mrs. Miles has made in the course of her canteen work is Capt. Robert Gannon, now of Escanaba, Michigan, who appealed to the Red Cross for help in making his boys more comfortable, as their encampment was practically without furnishings. He was turned over to Mrs. Miles and her canteen aids, who took
