

### Store Gives Away Prizes


Star Furniture store, 2103 Torrance boulevard, this week announced winners of a number of gifts given away as part of the store's twenty-third anniversary celebration.

### Normans Defeat Saxons, Score In Every Period

Outweighed six pounds per man by a Beverly Hills team that had seven returning lettermen in their starting line up, the North High Saxons lost their sixth straight game 7-34 last Friday night on the Torrance High field.

The contest, which was homecoming for North High, was the third Pioneer League loss for the Saxons, who now have a 0-3 league standing.

**Normans Collect**  
Beverly's grid-machine tallied the first time they had possession, their quarterback, Ronald Goldman, passing 66-yards to halfback, Joe Rosekrantz after the Saxons punted on fourth down. Other scorers and scoring plays for the Normans were: Fred Gaylord, halfback, 2, (16 and 78-yard runs); Goldman (2-yard end run); and Roger Reese, quarterback, (81-yard kick-off return). Mitch Reims and Ronald Cohen, back and guard, respectively, accounted for the extra points with two apiece.

**Saxons Score**  
It wasn't until midway in the fourth stanza that the Saxons drew blood. With his team behind 0-27, North's ace passer, Ray Grieshaber, fullback, fired 43-yards to Bob J. Turner, wingback, to the Norman 2. On the next play Grieshaber knifed through the line for the tally, and also converted in the same manner.

**Saxons Show Improvement**  
Mentor Cliff Greybehl's charges, who line up with a single wing to the right, looked like a very improved ball club, despite the margin of defeat (before the Beverly fray the Saxons lost 0-39 to Hawthorne, a team which had previously been dumped by the Normans 18-7) Ray Grieshaber was passing well, and also made some fine runs. However the hefty fullback usually left the "mail packing" to the other members of the backfield, Paul Carrico, quarterback, Jim Powers, tailback and Bob J. Turner, wingback.




