## 'FILPER PITTING' MAKES PEACHES PEACHIER NOW

A new invention now makes peaches peachier than ever! It's called "Filper Pitting," and with it cling peach pits drop out of the peach instead of having to be cut out with a knife.

  - 1 tablespoon lemon juice
  - Fresh mint or chopped nuts
- Drain peaches and reserve juice. Prepare ice cream mix according to directions on package. Use peach juice from canned peaches in place of milk called for (for a richer ice cream use half peach juice and half heavy cream). Stir in lem-


