Up She Goes

Last Labor Day, Fether climbed aboard the four-place Seabee, rose into the air from Redding Municipal Airport, and headed south toward Torrance Airport. It took him six hours to make the 500 mile flight, and there were times when he wondered if he was going to make it, or if he should have left the water-soaked airplane at the bottom of Shasta Lake.

Shortly after he left Redding, a loud banging noise interrupted the flight, and he stuck his head out of the plane's door to notice a fuel cap loose, hanging by a chain, and hitting against the fuselage. He sat down at Davis Airport, fixed the cap, and took off again before he noticed he was low on fuel seepage, and looked around for another place to land and top the gas tank. The last miles of his six hour flight were made in the dark, and it was a relieved and tired pilot who landed at Torrance Airport.

Fether says the plane still needs re-upholstering and painting before he can call it a finished product. But he figures that he'll have about \$4000 worth of flyable airplane when he's through—quite a transformation from the water-soaked craft which was pulled from Shasta Lake.

Rawn emphasized the critical need for public dumps. The proposed one, he said, would be filled within six to eight years and can then be converted into a park, for light manufacturing purposes, or for homes.

Then, on automatic appeal of either side, the Board of Supervisors will rule finally on the issue following another public hearing.

The zone board is expected to rule on the request for the zone variance to allow a dump in a few days.




