**Blind Man Originates And Directs Messiah Program**

The man who is guiding and coordinating the 9th annual presentation of the Messiah in 60 different localities of Southern California Sunday, December 4th, is blind according to the area manager of this community, Fred Lincoln.

He is Dr. Gordon Bachlund, director of sacred music for the Church Federation of Los Angeles. He will be the busiest man in Southern California December 4, when all 60 presentations of the Messiah will be held starting at 4 p.m. Locally, it will be sung at First Lutheran church, 2900 M. Carson St. A massed choir with singers from different churches of this community will sing, with Frank Owen as director.

Although sightless, Dr. Bachlund organizes and manages this musical festival — the largest of its kind in America, if not in the world. Something like 1800 choirs composed of 15,000 singers will be involved. It is estimated that more than 100,000 people will attend the 60 presentations of Handel's great oratorio, and a good crowd is expected for the local presentation.

The Messiah idea started with Dr. Bachlund and the Music Commission of the co-sponsoring Church Federation of Los Angeles and the Southern California Council of Protestant Churches. They thought first in terms of a major performance in the Shrine Auditorium, Los Angeles, and then, suddenly, the idea struck Dr. Bach-
