

El Camino Holds Annual Christmas Concert Sunday

Eighty voices of the El Camino college capella and community choirs will join the college's orchestra Sunday evening in presenting the annual Christmas concert in the Campus center.

The concert, to which the general public is invited without charge, will start at 8 p.m., Merl F. Sloan, director of student personnel, announced today.

Soloists who will perform are Tommy Gough, Jean Street, and Sue Bernard, soprano; Mary Wallenburg and Maurice Counsel, alto; and Bill Bahrt and Dick Schieffel, basses.

The first portion of the concert will center about the theme "The Coming of Jesus," and the second will feature a Christmas medley by the orchestra and selections from the Nutcracker Suite by the chorus and orchestra.

Numbers included in the first part are "Ten So Lord Jesus," "Jesus, Joy of Man's Desiring," excerpts from the Messiah, and a cantata, "Rejoice, Beloved Christians," by Butchude.

R. Neil Hill and Hamilton Maddaford are faculty directors of the musical event, assisted by Gordon Orme and Calvin Greer. Hill is director of the community capella choirs, while Maddaford will direct instrumental numbers.

Old Structure Rehabilitated At Douglas

An ideal structure for the storage of property and records has been rehabilitated at Douglas-Torrance because it was unsuitable for manufacturing activities.

First to be completed in a series of expansion projects at Torrance, the building formerly was used by the Aluminum Company of America as a service building for large rectifiers. It has five floors and 16,000 square feet of floor space. The structure is 60 feet high, 40 feet wide, and 80 feet long.

The first level is constructed of six inch concrete and nine and a half inch brick to make a fireproof vault. Records will be stored in identical files of interlocking cases.

On the second floor, surplus light machinery will be stored. The top three floors will contain office equipment not needed at the present time. A freight elevator provides convenient access to all levels.
