The time is now for the planting in your garden of various varieties of daffodil, tulip, and hyacinth bulbs. These three types all require the same growing conditions: partial shade, deep planting (five or six inches to the top of the bulb), and spacing of about six inches.

Most Popular
The most popular daffodil with home owners in this area is the large-yellow King Alfred. In selecting bulbs of this type you won't go wrong, for it is a beautiful flower and very handy in growth habits. Your Nursery and garden supply dealer also has other types for you to plant at this time, and once they are planted in your yard you may leave them, for it is not necessary to dig and divide each year. There seems to be lots of trouble with various gardeners in this area with the tulip. I've found that if they are planted deep after a precooling period of about 3 weeks in your refrigerator at a temperature of about 40 degrees, they will respond well. Shallow planting often makes the flowers open with little or no stem.

Most Fragrant
Hyacinths are among the most fragrant of bulb plants. Huge numbers of small flowers appear in masses on the stems in solid color of red, blue, white and yellow. Hyacinths are also good for pots, or for water culture. In the water culture method it is best to buy a regular hyacinth vase, which will allow the base of the bulb to be in the water at all times while growing. It is a good idea to pick up a package of bone meal and work it into the soil just below where the base of the bulb will be, and at the time that you pick up the bone meal also obtain a package of bulb feed to be used after the plants are above the ground.






