Noted 'Cellist Next Artist In Music Series

The next concert of the Youth Band-Artist Concerts Series will take place on Thursday night, February 9, and will feature as soloist the noted 'cellist, Joseph Schuster. This program, originally scheduled for February 16, was changed in order to allow Schuster to fulfill an important engagement with the Berlin Philharmonic.

Schuster, former first 'cellist with the Berlin orchestra, will leave for Europe immediately after his Torrance appearance.

Schuster's share of the program will include the Introduction, Adagio and Allegro, from the Concerto in D Major by Tartini, the Sonate Arpeggione, in A minor (Allegro moderato, Adagio, and Allegretto) by Schubert, and the Rocco Variations, Opus 33, by Tschalkowsky.

The Torrance Area Youth Band will play the first half of the concert featuring Jackie Johnston, clarinetist, as soloist.

This is the second of a series of concerts sponsored by the Youth Band-Artist Concerts association. Other concerts are scheduled for April 10, with Claramae Turner as soloist, and May 23, with the four student scholarship winners as soloists.

Admittance to these concerts is by season ticket, however, a few seats are available for those desiring to attend only individual performances.


