

Baptists Set Bible Reading Crusade Plan

During the month of February, the Narbonne Avenue Baptist church, 24730 Narbonne ave., with Robert A. Wells, pastor, will cooperate with other churches of the Southern Baptist convention in a Bible reading crusade. The local church is seeking to enlist every member in reading the Bible daily.

This crusade is sponsored by the training union of the local church as a regular part of its program of training, but will be

expanded during February to include every organization of the church. The goal of the Crusade will be to have as many people reporting their readings as are present in training union each Sunday night. There are now 278 persons enrolled in training union.

Beginning today, February 9, the book, "What Baptists Believe" will be taught from 12:30 to 2:30 p.m. The book will be taught on consecutive Thursdays during the month of February at this time. This is one of the series of studies offered for the benefit of the Sunday School teachers and workers.
