Safety Belts Installed by Local Firm

Installation of safety belts in all of its field cars has been ordered by the National Supply company.

The order affects approximately 700 vehicles, including passenger cars and trucks under the 7-ton weight line, thus constituting one of the largest installations of safety belts yet announced.

Company officers made their decision after a study of reports that the most severe injuries in automobile accidents are caused when the driver is thrown against the steering post, passengers are thrown forward against hard interior

surfaces, or persons are thrown out of a car.

Two safety belts are being installed on the front seat of each car, one for the driver and the other for the passenger in the right-hand seat. A ticker is placed on the dashboard to remind occupants to fasten the belts, a simple "plug-in" operation that requires approximately one second. The belts can be unfastened almost instantly.

The National Supply company, which has its general offices in Pittsburgh, is the world's largest manufacturer and distributor of oil field machinery. Many of its cars are used over primitive roads, in rugged country, between the company's 125 oil field supply stores and the drilling rigs and pumping units of the surrounding area.

Harbor JC Has Record Enrollment

Student enrollment for the spring semester at Harbor junior college has topped all previous records since the opening of the college in September, 1949, Raymond J. Casey, college director stated today.

According to officials records, 1,038 students have registered in day classes and 1,640 in evening classes bringing the total to 2,678 students on campus. This total surpasses last spring's semester totals by 54 day students and 282 evening students.

When Harbor junior college its doors in September, 1949, 523 day students signed into classes and only 60 extended-day students registered. The new figure shows a gain of 515 students in daytime classes and 1,580 students during the evening hours.

With record enrollments in surrounding high schools and junior high schools, Harbor Junior College according to the experts, may look forward to increased enrollments each semester through 1963 when a leveling off period is predicted.
