James Hall maintains, is that the court rested its decision on another Supreme Court ruling (Peters vs. Hobby) which does not apply in this case.

According to that case, the body involved had the power to reduce or eliminate the punishment but not to increase it.

However, Hall said, that body did not have legal powers whereas the City Council has been given legal powers by the city charter.

The other error involves the court's concept that the city manager was the head of the building department and not Dresser.

"We intend to show what the charter shows — namely, what his duties consist of and the fact that he is in a managerial position over all the heads of the departments," Hall said.

Hall said that the petition for rehearing will be filed shortly. If it is denied, the city will know in about 30 days whether the State Supreme Court will hear the case or not. It will then take about four months to obtain a decision.







### I HAVE SOME MORE TO SAY ABOUT REAL ESTATE

In this newspaper last week, I stated that I agreed with an editorial appearing in the Torrance Herald on April 3, 1952. In effect, the editorial said "real estate men should not be Councilmen" ... and ... "the best interests of the city are not served when a Councilman is called upon to represent the city as a buyer of land or property while simultaneously acting as an agent of the seller."

This was not an attack on the real estate profession. Certainly, under democratic standards, realtors are eligible for election to the City Council—but ONLY IF THE INDIVIDUAL ELECTED IS WILLING TO PLACE THE WELFARE OF THE CITY AND ITS PEOPLE ABOVE HIS OWN PERSONAL BUSINESS INTERESTS.

It is technically legal and advisable for a councilman to decline to vote on an issue in which he has a personal and/or financial interest. HOWEVER, SUCH A REALTOR-COUNCILMAN WHO MUST DO THIS ON NUMEROUS OCCASIONS—AS HAS BEEN DEMONSTRATED BY ONE MEMBER OF THE PRESENT CITY COUNCIL—is ABSOLUTELY NOT FULFILLING HIS MORAL OBLIGATIONS TO THE VOTERS OF TORRANCE ... NOR IS HE ENHANCING THE GOOD NAME OF THE REAL ESTATE PROFESSION.

One councilman, for example, just last week declined to vote on two tract maps involving 97 Torrance residential lots ... because, in his own words, "I have a financial interest in this." When a councilman consistently declines to vote "for" or "against" important issues, he is depriving every man, woman, and child in Torrance of the representation to which they are entitled by law.

I firmly believe that the general real estate profession has contributed greatly to the tremendous growth and development of Torrance. I know we're going to continue to grow. Progress is an inevitable "must." THEREFORE, I US ELECT AS PUBLIC OFFICIALS THOSE PERSONS WHO HAVE DEMONSTRATED THAT THEY HAVE THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE PEOPLE AT HEART, AND HAVE NO STRINGS ATTACHED TO PREVENT THEM FROM VOTING EITHER "YES" OR "NO" ON MULTI-MILLION DOLLAR ISSUES AFFECTING THOUSANDS OF TORRANCE CITIZENS.
