contract and they, too, were given an extension of time. **Times Improve**
At this writing, August, 1916, the Union Tool Company has resumed work, now employing nearly 400 men; the Llewellyn Iron Works is erecting its plant and the Pacific Electric is to start construction at once. There is absolute stagnation, however, in the real estate business and sales are nil.

We are erecting an additional hundred bungalows to meet a prospective early demand but

they will, for the greater part, be rented.

The enterprise has few stockholders. For the greater part they are men of means. It was the expressed wish of these latter gentlemen that the first consideration should be to do things right.

Plans were carefully considered and all construction work was of the most thorough character. Material results were to be the first consideration.

Plans
Sewers, paved streets and all

public utilities were constructed in advance; alleys which contained all pole lines and water and gas mains were provided throughout the townsite; ample reservations were made for public parks, an athletic park and for playgrounds; a civic center was designed; upwards of 300,000 trees were planted in streets and windbreaks; and several acres were reserved for public schools to be donated to the public, upon certain conditions as to the character and completeness of the improvements to be erected thereon.

Very particular attention was given to the proper housing of the future employees
