First Christian Church to Hold Dedication Services

As the conclusion of a three year building program, the First Christian church, 2930 El Dorado ave., will be dedicated Sunday, May 6, at 3 p.m. Rev. James Parrott, executive secretary of the Christian Missionary society of Southern California will preach the dedicatory sermon. Former ministers will participate in the service. Leonard Babcock, who has been associated with the church since its founding, will tell of its beginning and growth. Both choirs will assist. The church is patterned on colonial lines with separate units which house the church school, the fellowship hall, and the sanctuary. The property is valued at \$250,000. Reverend H. Milton Sippel announced. Much of the labor was donated by members and friends of the church.

Ingathering Goal Reached by Adventists

This week the Torrance Seventh-day Adventist church, 1610 Acacia ave., reached its annual Ingathering goal, it was announced. The sum of \$2770 was set by the Southern California Conference for the Torrance church to raise, based on a Minuteman goal of \$22.35 for each member. It is calculated that the worldwide work of the church, including its schools, hospitals, and missions, costs \$22.35 per minute to operate, Ellene Zumwalt reported. On behalf of Seventh-day Adventist church members, Pastor Glenn L. Goffar stated, "It is only through the generosity of local businessmen and the community at large that the Ingathering campaign was successful. We wish to express our appreciation and extend our sincere thanks to those who have contributed to this annual endeavor." The two Torrance Dorcas Welfare societies, under the leadership of Mrs. Vivian Crow and Mrs. Myrtle Gilman, and individual church members keep watch for opportunities to assist the needy. During the first three months of 1956, reports show that 219 persons were helped by giving them 395 articles of clothing, 54 food baskets, and other items, the pastor said. There were 474 hours donated to welfare activities, he said.
