Dwight D. Eisenhower has proclaimed the month of May as Sports Festival Month and in keeping with this theme, the Torrance Recreation Department has planned a special program emphasizing sports. The festival is sponsored by 13 national organizations including the U. S. Olympic committee, the U. S. Junior Chamber of Commerce, American Recreation society, National recreation association, national Industrial Recreation association,

tion, Sport Fishing Institute, National Golf foundation, the Athletic institution, Izack Walton league, American Institute of Park Executives, American Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation, Society of State Directors of Health, Physical education and recreation, and National Federation of State High School Athletic associations. The purpose of the festival is to emphasize the importance of family recreation activities to wholesome community living and to stress the values of well conducted athletic programs and recreation activities in the community. It is hoped that by encouraging wide spread interest and support in sound recreation programs more people of all ages will attain a greater measure of fitness and happiness through participation in community organized sports programs. President Eisenhower in his proclamation said: "We shall continue our efforts in the executive office to encourage programs aimed toward family unity and youth developments." He goes on to say, "I hope that our schools, recreation departments, youth organizations, churches and other civic groups will find in the 1956 National Sports Festival a means of highlighting the good work they are now doing and of enlisting community cooperation in making their programs even more effective."
