100-ton ammonia refrigeration units are the equivalent of 600 home freezers.

All processing equipment coming in contact with the product will consist of stainless steel. Walls and floors will be covered completely with tile. The plant, which will be as nearly automatic as possible, will be thoroughly air-conditioned.

Carnation is adding about 600 HP of electrical capacity to the present plant, officials said.





### Kiwanis Club Hears Shell Corp. Talk

"Shell Chemical corporation, Torrance plant, is now supplying 80% of the synthetic rubber used in the eleven Western States," stated Don Limerick, assistant supervisor of production.

In an address to the Kiwanis club of Torrance recently, Limerick explained the basic principles of synthetically producing rubber from Styrene and Butadiene, and showed by colored film, the actual processing.

He also pointed out that the local plant is now producing over 10% of the nation's supply of this product.
