Rev. R. Tepe to Celebrate Silver Jubilee

Reverend Raymond J. Tepe, pastor of St. Catherine Labouré parish, will celebrate the Silver Jubilee of his ordination to the priesthood with a solemn Mass of thanksgiving, on Wednesday, May 30, at 11 a.m.
Mass will be followed by an informal reception lasting until 4 p.m., to which all parishioners and friends have been invited.
Reverend Tepe was born in April, 1906, in Quincy, Illinois; the son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Tepe. He came to Los Angeles with his parents at the age of three.
He began priestly studies at St. Patrick's seminary, Menlo Park, in September, 1920.
He was ordained to the priesthood at St. Vibiana's Cathedral,

by Archbishop Cantwell on May 30, 1931.
He was appointed to St. Catherine Labouré of North Torrance in July of 1949.
In the seven years Reverend Tepe has served as pastor of St. Catherine's the parish has grown from 350 families to 2200 families.
A school was built and now has an enrollment of 540 students.
A convent adequate for 11 nuns has been added and a new \$300,000 church is now under construction, to be completed before the end of the year, Mrs. T. Frontiera reported.
