### Mental Health Problems on Elementary Level Discussed

Heading the program for the May meeting of 259th Place was Mrs. Ruth Walker, school psychologist for the South district offices. She discussed mental health problems on the elementary level.

Mrs. Walker said "Emotional maladjustment may be brought about by many factors. Some of the basic needs of all of us are love, achievement, recognition, belonging, freedom from fear or guilt, self-respect, and understanding of the world in which we live."

"A child needs to feel secure in these things too, and must have adult help for basic understanding," she continued.

"The child may have headaches, stomachaches, show overdependence, live in fantasy or regress into babyhood, as a result of emotional problems. He tries to escape from reality," she pointed out.

"The child may feel resentment against something that may be necessarily good for him and must be shown how to face his problems correctly," she said.

Mrs. Walker works with

school personnel and parents. If the problem persists she may refer the case to the PTA Guidance Center or the State Mental Hygiene clinic in San Pedro. This clinic serves the Harbor area and works with the family as a unit.

A report on the CCPT convention was given by Mrs. Palmer Orseth. "Our Investment in America" will be the State theme for the 1956-57 year.


