


## Stunt Show To Aid Olympics

The first international competition in automobile and motorcycle stunting will be held on Saturday and Sunday nights at Gardena Stadium when the combined Motor Olympics and Tournament of Thrills are presented for the benefit of the U. S. Olympic Fund.

Teams from England, Australia, Mexico, Germany, Canada and the United States will vie not only in stunts of various kinds, but will compete in what is considered the most dangerous sport in the world, sidcar motorcycle racing.

Among the competitive events will be broadjumping new automobiles for distance, racing them on two wheels, precision driving, broadjumping and racing motorcycles and crash rolling cars for number of revolutions and for distance.

Among the specialty numbers will be shooting a new Ford from the world's largest cannon and over three other cars racing underneath; blowing a man up with 20 sticks of dynamite; and Linda Villaseor, of Bogota, Columbia, performing on a trapeze rigged high above a speeding automobile.



## 140 Pints Of Blood Given By Warriors

El Camino Warriors contributed 140 pints of blood as the Red Cross Bloodmobile established temporary headquarters on campus. Mrs. Ruth Mazak was faculty chairman of the drive.

A total of 149 donors volunteered to give blood, with nine being rejected, Mrs. Mazak said. Of the donors, 82 contributed blood for the first time.

Campus organizations, in competition for a perpetual trophy given to the club whose members contribute the most blood on a percentage basis, accounted for almost 100 pints. Faculty members and employees of the college contributed 16 pints, while 33 students with no club affiliation served as donors.

Winning the trophy for the semester was Lambda Delta Sigma, a special interest group, with 70 points. Points and pints of blood do not coincide in the method of scoring utilized.

Runners-up were the Chi Theta Chi sorority and the Phi Sigma Upsilon fraternity. Also placing high on the list were the Thes-Arpeans, Xi Iota Chi, the International Relations club and Delta Sigma Chi.
