

### Torrance Boy Wins Army Track Laurels

Lee Francis, 24, former star athlete at Narbonne High School continues to rack up track honors while serving in the U. S. Army, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Paul Francis, of 18513 Regina ave., disclosed this week.

Lee, who is serving his fifth year in the Army, earned four new laurels at an all-army track meet held recently in La Rochelle, France. A member of the Basec track team, he won the 800, 1,500 and 3,000 meter runs and ran the first leg of a record winning, 1,600 meter relay.

His 4:37.7 effort in the 1,500 meters erased the Basec record. As the outstanding trackman at the meet, Lee was presented with a trophy, three wrist watches won in various events and a set of luggage. His first place watch was sent home as a gift to his father, it was reported.

Lee, who was a stellar performer in track, football, and basketball at Narbonne, has a brother, John, 19, also in the army, and three sisters, Mrs. Paula Kleinmann of Hermosa Beach, and Rosemary, 14, and Kathleen, 14, both students at North High in Torrance.

Torrance's 16 buses and 23 drivers cover 62,000 miles a month.

### Annual Report Of California Bank Issued

California Bank resources increased by \$133,870,998, or 18 per cent during the past year to reach a total of \$868,100,644 on June 30, according to Frank L. King, president.

Deposits increased from \$683,368,621 a year ago to \$800,378,915. Loans advanced to \$393,214,587 from \$264,305,803.

Net profits for the six months ended June 30 amounted to \$2,232,394, an increase of 31 per cent from \$1,704,008 earned in the first six months of 1955. This amounts of \$1.56 per share based on the 1,433,110 shares outstanding June 30, 1956 equal to the \$1.56 per share based on 1,091,500 shares outstanding at June 30 a year ago.

Capital funds of \$54,295,488 consisted of capital stock \$17,913,875, surplus \$25,586,125, and undivided profits \$10,795,488.

### King Wins Highest Vote In Southland

Congressman Cecil R. King, 17th District Democratic victor, received more votes in the recent primary election than any other U.S. Representative from the Southland, according to official figures released by Registrar of Voters Ben S. Hite.

A canvass of the vote also revealed that King received more votes than any other candidate in his district, including President, Eisenhower or Governor Stevenson.

### Civic Leaders Endorse Oil Conservation Bill on Ballot

Protection against spiralling gasoline prices, safeguards against higher taxes and stabilization of employment are among statewide benefits envisioned in a voters argument, filed with the Secretary of State, and made public today, urging adoption of the Oil and Gas Conservation Act, designated as Proposition 4 on the November ballot.

Three widely known California leaders of broadly representative groups signed the argument. They are Brig. Gen. Warren T. Hannum USA (Ret.), prominent Republican and former Director of the State Department of Natural Resources; Roger Kent, long active conservationist and vice chairman of the Democratic State Central Committee; and Lewis Gough, Los Angeles civic leader and past National Commander of the American Legion.

Citing the "tragic loss" of nearly 75 per cent of the State's petroleum resources "under present primary oil recovery methods," the argument asserts that 12 billion dollars in new wealth that would flow into the State's economy is the stake the people of California have in passage of the Act.

### New Beach Rates Fixed

Weekday rates for parking autos at the Torrance Beach parking lot were cut in half Tuesday by the County Board of Supervisors.

The action was taken after the board received a communication from the Torrance City Council protesting charges for parking at the county-owned lot.
