Victim Of Rabid Dog Bite Gets Pasteur Treatment

An act of kindness to an injured dog is not without its difficulties, according to Bill Montgomery, 17-year-old Torrance high school senior.

Bill is now undergoing a series of 21 Pasteur shots following a bite by a rabid dog.

The Montgomery family, of 1839 Reynosa dr., Torrance, while on a vacation trip in

Illinois, stopped to aid an injured dog by the roadside. They picked up the dog to take it to a vet and Bill received a minor bite. The dog died at the vet's.

The Illinois College of Veterinary Medicine tested the animal and found it rabid. Pasteur treatments were begun immediately on Bill. He is continuing to receive the shots, at the rate of one each day from a local physician, his family reported.

Dr. Ben Kogan, of the Torrance county health office, declared that the bite would have been fatal to Bill had the Montgomerys left the dog by the road and ignored the small bite. The Doctor emphasized the importance of thoroughly investigating and reporting all dog bites.

The Montgomerys have two other children, Joe, 13, and Julia, 20.

Rolling Hills Files for New City; Foils Lomita

A move to halt efforts toward the incorporation of Lomita and Rolling Hills into one city was taken last Friday when papers were filed to create a new city in Rolling Hills.

A legal description of a proposed city that would be known as Rancho Vista has been filed with the County Boundary Commission, it was reported by Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

This move forestalls efforts by a Lomita group to include the same area in a new incorporated city to be called Lomita.

Further Study
Tim McCormick, manager of the Lomita Chamber of Commerce and a proponent of the plan to incorporate the two areas, stated that his group is taking the new development under further study and has no statement to make.

The petition submitted by the Rolling Hills people prevents the Lomita group from including that portion of the hills in any incorporation proposal for 50 days.

Boundaries
Boundaries of the proposed Rancho Vista generally are Torrance city limits, Palos Verdes Estates, Crest Road, and a line about a half mile east of Narbonne ave.

The petition was filed by George Denbo of 5030 Range Horse rd.; Emery Belyea of 26712 Westvale rd. and Harry Cheshire Jr. of 4435 Ranch View rd.

Excluded from the new city is the territory within the gates of the Rolling Hills Community Association. This area has already begun proceedings to incorporate as a city.

Over-All Plan
Community leaders from Rolling Hills and Lomita met last week to discuss the over-all incorporation plan, which was initiated by Lomitans three weeks ago.

The Rolling Hills representatives requested a two week delay in any further action so they could poll their people on the question of joining with Lomita. On Friday morning they filed the new petition.

Opinions regarding the joint incorporation have been split in both communities. Lomita forces opposing the idea declared at Thursday's meeting that the county has consistently provided adequate public service to the area.

However, Chamber of Commerce spokesmen pointed out that should Rancho Vista be incorporated, Lomita would then become an isolated county island. They predicted that this would jeopardize the communities future progress.

Councilmen Up in Air Over Hogs

Torrance city officials let it be known last night that they intend to go hog-wild on legal action, unless owners of three hog farms get rid of the animals by Oct. 1.

Stanley E. Remelmeier, Acting City Attorney, reported that two of the hog ranchers had requested a time extension of 12 to 18 months.

The attorney said there is some question as to the constitutionality of a city ordinance which will make swine animals non grata after Oct. 1.

"Let's get rid of the hogs," snapped Mayor Albert Isen and the other Councilmen agreed.

Remelmeier was instructed to file a civil suit and a criminal action on grounds the hog farms are a public nuisance, unless the owners move out by the deadline.

Two of the farms are located on Spencer St. near Madrona Ave. and the other on Redondo Beach Blvd. near Beryl Ave.

Board OKs Huge Budget

A record budget of \$6,730,263 was adopted by the Torrance Board of Education last Tuesday night.

The new budget will operate on a deficit basis this year, Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent of schools said. Enormous growth of the schools and the current ceiling on school tax makes this necessary, he said.

The schools are asking the voters to approve a hike in the tax ceiling at a special election in October.
