### Appointment To Board Clarified

The School Board's appointment of Clinton B. Cook, successor to Dr. Joseph A. Bay, optometrist, who resigned from the board was explained by Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent of schools, this week.  
The Torrance city charter (article 6, section 5) gives the members of the board the right to fill a vacancy within 30 days, Dr. Hull stated.  
He also referred to an article written by the county superintendent of schools in which he indicated that it is not good policy to appoint defeated school board candidates, since the voters did not see fit to elect them in the first place.  
The article further indicates that the County Board of Education generally accepts an appointment which has received the unanimous approval of the local board.
