In addition to his parents, young Jenocovich is survived by six sisters, Mrs. Elizabeth Jane Smith, Mrs. Barbara P. Deshler, and Dorothy Ann Jenocovich of Torrance, Mrs. Francis May Armijo of Lomita, Mrs. Pauline E. Taylor of Long Beach, and Marie A. Jenocovich of Lompoc; and two brothers, William Murrey of Lompoc and Edward Raymond of Torrance.

Interment was in Holy Cross cemetery.
