committee will meet tonight.
The fund-drive to raise \$766,320 in Torrance and the beach cities for the new tax-free Little Company of Mary hospital was launched Friday at a preliminary luncheon meeting.
George W. Post, of the Torrance branch of the California Bank, who has been named treasurer of the campaign, called the meeting to explain to representatives of Torrance civic groups the objectives of the Catholic nursing sisters who will operate the 125 bed institution and to discuss plans for the campaign organization.
The new hospital to be located on Torrance blvd., near the intersection of Hawthorne blvd. will serve Torrance, Palos Verdes Estates, Rolling Hills, Holly-

wood-Riviera, Hermosa Beach, Redondo Beach, and Manhattan Beach.

Critical Shortage

This area is described by the California department of Public Health as having the most critical shortage of hospital facilities of any area in the entire state.
Attending Friday's meeting were: George Post, assistant manager, California Bank, Torrance branch; The Rt. Rev. Msgr. Thomas J. O'Dwyer, director of health and welfare, Archdiocese of Los Angeles; King Williams, publisher Torrance Herald; Leonard Ensminger, superintendent Torrance Memorial hospital; Dr. Kurt Sherry, president of the state Torrance Memorial hospital; Dr. Ray Larson, president Rotary club; Joe Doss, president, Kiwanis club; Dean L. Sears, manager, Bank of America, Torrance branch; Bill King, advertising manager, Torrance Press and member of the planning commission; A. B. Robinson, president of the Lions club; and Sam Levy, Torrance businessman and civic leader.

Post said the gathering was primarily to inform major civic interests of the need and of the sponsorship of the new institution.

"Even though we have recently completed a campaign for expansion of the Torrance Memorial Hospital," he declared, "we still face an extremely critical hospital bed-shortage which jeopardize the health security of every resident of the South Bay cities area."
"This new Catholic hospital will be patterned after some 4,000 community and denominational hospitals across the nation which have proven to be the backbone of the highest standards of medical care. It will be a voluntary, non-profit, tax-free institution, fully accredited, which will assure our people of the best possible hospital care."

Campaign

The fund campaign will be conducted by Western Associates Financing Counsel, Inc., of Beaumont, California, which during the past five years has directed numerous successful hospital drives in Southern California communities. Campaign headquarters have been established at 1728 Andreo avenue Torrance. An information office will be located in Redondo Beach. Co-directors of the fund raising effort will be James B. Crane, Western Associates vice president, and Richard D. Pearsall.

The project will cost approximately \$2,300,000. Tangible recognition of the great need of the area came at Berkeley last month when the State Advisory Council allocated \$766,320 in federal funds and a like amount from the state to cover \$1,532,640 of the total cost. Shoestring Improvements Announced

Two more street improvement jobs in the Shoestring Strip area have been let to contract, it was announced today by Councilman John S. Gibson.

Paving of 223rd street with construction of curbs, gutters and sidewalks will be done at a cost of \$39,675, the councilman said, while sidewalks are to be installed in the 209th-211th streets, and Brighton to Normandie area at a cost of \$49,711. McAmis and Baker were low bidders on both projects.

At the same time Councilman Gibson revealed an appropriation of \$2200 for the preparation of plans for the lateral storm drain on Halldale avenue, which will connect with the county flood control drain at 212th street. Complete financing of this project, estimated at \$24,000, will be undertaken in next year's budget.

The latest contract awards pushes the total in street improvements in the Shoestring area to well past the \$145,000 mark for the year, Gibson said. Work is nearing completion on the 224th street and Halldale job while improvement of 205th street from Harvard to Denker and 227th street from Western to Halldale, already has been completed.

Two other jobs on which work is expected to begin shortly include a pedestrian crossing over the Pacific Electric tracks at 223rd street to provide a safe route to the new 223rd street school, and a temporary sidewalk on Normandie avenue from 211th street to Carson avenue, providing a route for children attending Halldale school.

In awarding the contracts, the Board of Public Works said work would be started within 30 days.
