#### BLEEDING GUMS CAUSE LOSS OF TEETH

##### QUESTION—

"The gums around my lower front teeth bleed very easily. How can this condition be cured?" asks Mrs. R. K. of Lomita.

##### ANSWER—

Bleeding of the gums around the teeth might be caused by either of two things—tartar accumulation irritating the gums or excessive pressure caused by chewing mainly towards the front of the mouth.

Where the back teeth are missing and not replaced, the two jaws will come closed together than they should so that the upper front teeth come down over the lower more than they did before. Overlapping creates more pressure, resulting in strain on the teeth and damage to the bony support, which in turn is accompanied by inflammation and congestion of the gums. Then, the gums bleed easily.

This is also aggravated by tartar accumulations on the inside surfaces of the teeth.

If these conditions are not corrected, the overtaxed teeth will be endangered. Of course, there are other causes for bleeding gums but the two above are among the most prominent.

tics, ship building and others.

The 98,000 sq. ft. building will be located on a 10-acre site, according to E. L. Stone, general manager of Vickers incorporated, El Segundo division.

The facility will be used as engineering, sales and production facility to produce hydraulic equipment. Part of the present operation will be moved from El Segundo.

Date of occupancy has been set for March 1957. Donald F. Shaw is general contractor. Donald R. Warren co. are the engineers.

Vickers Manufacturing co. was founded in 1920 in Los Angeles by Harry F. Vickers, a pioneer hydraulic engineer. In 1925 Vickers developed a hydraulic steering gear for motor vehicles and a high pressure vane pump.

With the development of additional products the company expanded rapidly and was renamed Vickers incorporated.

In 1930, an experimental plant was established in Detroit, Michigan, and by the end of 1930 the entire business was transferred to Detroit.

The expansion of the company over the years has resulted in the establishment of plants in Michigan, Connecticut, Nebraska, Oklahoma, Missouri, Mississippi and California.


