understanding in his home in order to tolerate giving up of himself to conform.

### BRUTAL TREATMENT

2. A ten-year-old girl who had been brutally treated by a relative in her home made a suicide attempt when the relative was sent to a mental hospital for treatment. Her mother, through the family situation had been despondent for many months to the point where she was unable to work. The case was receiving county aid to needy children.

The girl was treated psycho-therapeutically for a period of eight months.

The mother had been in a state of depression for two years and was progressively getting worse, so she was also treated psycho-therapeutically.

As a result of the treatment, the mother's depression was lifted and she was able to return to work and able to be active socially. She met a fine understanding widower and has become engaged.

The child no longer has nightmares and daytime fears, and is more comfortable with her playmates and is looking forward to her mother's approaching marriage and to having a step-sister of her same age.

### EMOTIONAL DISTURBANCE

3. An intelligent 16-year-old boy and his mother were referred to the clinic for aid regarding an acute emotional disturbance of the boy, following the loss of his father after a long illness. The mother was receiving county aid to needy children for the support of the boy and his younger sister.

After immediate treatment at the psychiatric unit of the Los Angeles General hospital, the boy was referred back to the clinic, for follow-up psychiatric therapy to maintain the gains made during his hospitalization.

Following treatment at the clinic, the boy gained sufficient insight and understanding of his illness so that he's back at school and adjusting well to his studies and his school mates. The mother relieved of the anxiety about the boy has been able to take a job and support herself and the children.

Psychology can help those who are emotionally disturbed and mentally ill. But every psychiatrist and psychiatrist will agree that the patient must WANT to be helped if treatment is to be successful.






