Local School Picture Critical, Unless...

(Editor's note: This is the first in a series of articles intended to explain in clear, simple terms the meaning of the two important school issues to be voted on in Torrance.)

Torrance voters will be asked to endorse two local school propositions at a special election, October 9. Passage of both bills is vital. If either bill passes while the other does not, the bill that passes would be virtually useless and the effect would be crippling.

- Here's why.
1. Present funds are insufficient to get children off double session and build additionally needed schools.
 2. About nine schools are needed immediately.
 3. These can be built by going on the State loan program (the district is asking for a loan up to \$14 million, if necessary).
 4. The State loan money may be used only for the construction of elementary schools.
 5. The money may not be used for equipping the new buildings; the cost of educating new children moving into the district; or providing higher teacher salaries to keep competent help and meet the competitive market.
 6. Therefore, an override tax is necessary to provide money for these expenses.
 7. Voters will be asked to approve a 75 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation override tax. The board does not intend to use the full tax every year (probably around 50 cents).

School Tax Election October 9

The override tax election and State loan election for Torrance will be held Tuesday, October 9, 1956. There will be a total of 23 precincts. Each elementary and high school in the district will be a polling place and one will be at the El Retiro park recreation building.

The remaining two polls will be at 5305 Carol Drive in the Seaside Rancho area and at 142 Via Pasqual in the Riviera area. The polls will be open between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. All voters will be notified of their precincts by individual postcard.

Voters, who will be absent from their precinct on election day, may make application in writing to the Los Angeles County Superintendent of Schools, 808 North Hill street, Los Angeles 12, for "Absent Voter Ballot" from September 19 to October 3 inclusive. Application must be signed by the voter in his own handwriting and must include the following:

1. The reason for absence from the polls on election day.
2. Signature of the applicant.
3. The name and home address of applicant.
4. The address to which the applicant wishes ballot sent.

A form for application may be secured at the Torrance Unified School District administrative offices, 2335 Plaza del Amo.

County Approves Recreation Funds

A contract appropriating \$4,822 of County funds to the city of Torrance for an after-school hour recreation program was approved Tuesday by Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

County funds appropriated, Chace declared, are in direct proportion to an amount budgeted for the program by the city and will be used to carry on an extended recreation program on city playgrounds during the after-school hours and week-ends.
