

OFFERINGS SLATED FOR NAVAJOS

Better educational and health facilities for American's Indian young people is the objective of a special offering to which members of the Torrance Seventh-day Adventist church will contribute on Saturday, September 22.

A co-education boarding school for Navajo and other Indian youngsters at Holbrook, Arizona, and Monument Valley mission school and clinic at Monument Valley, Utah, are two projects which will benefit from the offering, according to Pastor Glenn L. Goffar.

The Holbrook school annually provides education opportunities for some 125 students, ranging in age from six to twenty. Because of lack of facilities, hundreds more have to be turned away each year from the 10-grade school, established in 1947 by the Adventist denomination.
