Need For School Tax Issue Told, Cost Explained

(Editor's note: This is the second in a series of articles intended to explain why Torrance voters are being asked to approve two school tax issues in a special election October 9.)

1. It is important that both tax issues pass. One provides more school buildings, teacher salaries, and the funds for educating new children moving into the district.

2. One tax issue without the other is useless.

3. The State loan tax (for additional buildings) will not increase the tax rate over the present 40 cents ceiling. It will only extend the payments.

4. The 75 cents override tax (for equipment and salaries) is figured per \$100 valuation. If the full tax were levied it would cost a home owner with a house assessed at \$2000 for tax purposes \$15 a year (about 4 1/2 cents a day). It is planned to levy only 50 cents instead of the full 75 cents override tax, however.

5. The balance of the \$10 million bond issue which was approved recently will be used to finance the new high school construction now under way.

6. The money from the proposed tax issues will be used for the construction and equipment of about 9 elementary schools.

7. Both tax issues have been endorsed by the following groups: the Torrance Industries Tax Committee (which represents about 60% of the assessed valuation of Torrance); Torrance Chamber of Commerce; Oil Chemical and Atomic Workers International Union, Local 1-519; Lioness club; Walteria Civic association; El Nido Civic Improvement association; executive board of the Torrance Woman's club; and a number of PTAs.
