## Welfare Council Endorses Harbor Hospital Proposition

Board of directors of the Harbor Area Welfare Planning Council, after lengthy discussion, unanimously endorsed Proposition B, for the expansion of facilities at Harbor General hospital, on the November 6 ballot during a recent meeting held in Lomita. Mrs. Virginia McQuarry presided.

Proposition B calls for the election of permanent hospital buildings to replace the antiquated army barracks currently in use, at a cost of \$15,000,000. The present 101 barracks buildings house approximately 28 patients per ward, making it

difficult to assign personnel efficiently. Last year the hospital served 13,071 bed patients and 113,000 out-patients in the hospital clinics from the Harbor Area. Members of the board went on record urging the support of civic, service and philanthropic organizations in the Harbor Area for the passage of Proposition B in the forthcoming election.

## Levy Heads HG Hospital Bond Drive

County supervisors today named Sam Levy, prominent in civic work in Torrance, as chairman of the citizens committee to push passage of the \$15,400,000 bond issue—Proposition B on the November ballot—to replace vitally needed county hospital facilities.

Levy, who lives at 1503 El Prado in Torrance, was nominated for the chairmanship of the committee by Supervisor Chairman Burton W. Chase and approved by unanimous vote of the Board of Supervisors.

He is a pioneer merchant and civic leader of Torrance. He is chairman of the Harbor Community Chest; chairman of the Torrance YMCA fund-raising drive in 1956; past chairman of the Jewish Welfare Fund Drive; life member of Torrance YMCA and area chairman of the City of Hope.

The bond issue is to construct replacement facilities of 700 beds for the existing county hospital facilities at Harbor General hospital as the first of four more needed general hospitals in the community.

Levy, who with Supervisor Chase, is now appointing a committee to work on bringing the vital need for more hospital beds to the community, pointed out the bond issue has county-wide support.

"We must stress that every section of our county is to be served by the new hospital facilities and as the building program progresses there will be like facilities in all four corners of the county," Levy said.

## 3300 Volunteers Start 'Bigger Yes' Chest Drive

"Your answer: a bigger 'Yes' to the Community Chest."

With this slogan to sum up their campaign issues, more than 3300 volunteers will hit the streets this month to boost their proceeds to help meet the \$10,000,000 goal.

This was announced yesterday by Arthur O. Otsea, Harbor area campaign chairman, and vice-president and manager of the California bank, Torrance. The slogan for the current Chest appeal was developed by a committee drawn from the American Association of Advertising Agencies, led by Robert Debban of J. Walter Thompson co.

Goal for the current appeal, \$10,000,000, is \$800,000 more than total gifts last year. "These clinics, children's homes and other services were developed because our people need them," Otsea said. "The agencies must have at least \$800,000 more this year just to match the tide of population and mounting costs of operation."

"This is the 'bigger yes' manifest in dollars. It is the answer Los Angeles area must give if we are to retain the advantages of federation fund raising," Otsea continued.

"Everyone of us has heard people deplore the never ending appeals for money. Most of us have neither the time nor the money for all of them, and we cannot personally assess each of them to be sure they are sound, necessary and efficient."

Continuing, Otsea said, "Yet we want to be assured that our money is wisely spent, that our own community's health and welfare is safeguarded, and only

● THE MOTORIST'S INTEREST, THE PUBLIC INTEREST, YOUR INTEREST — CLEARLY IS IN BOOSTING SUPPLIES OF LOW-COST CALIFORNIA OIL, AND KEEPING GASOLINE PRICES DOWN, BY ENACTMENT OF PROPOSITION 4.
