WORKSHOP STARTED FOR HANDICAPPED

New applications for work training are coming in at the rate of 10 to 15 per day from handicapped persons in the Harbor area at Community Rehabilitation Industries, 1438 E. Anaheim st., Long Beach.

Upsurge in applications appears to be directly due to the September CRI membership drive, said Loren L. Roberts of

Manhattan Beach. Roberts represents one of the sponsoring groups, Long Beach Tuberculosis and Health association.

CRI is the first sheltered workshop to open in the Harbor area and will serve handicapped men and women within commuting distance by providing employment training on a pay-as-you-learn basis.

Skill and work habits are developed to meet needs of competitive employment.

A research program, assigned by the Office of Vocational Research, U. S. Department of Health and Welfare, will be under the direction of Dr. Frank Kirkner, chief clinical psychologist at Long Beach Veterans Administration hospital.

Chest-Supported Hospital Helps Save Girl's Life

Children's Hospital, a Community Chest supported agency, means the difference between life and death for children of any age group, regardless of race, color or creed.

The ability to foot the hospital bill is a minor detail, which takes a back seat in the welfare of children.

Such is the case of Carol Sue Morris, five-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Donald Morris, 142 East 215th street, Wilmington.

Stricken at the age of seven months with a celiac condition, a digestive problem, the infant hovered near death's door despite every medical aid, and was admitted to Children's Hospital in Los Angeles in an attempt to save her life.


Constant loving care, expert medical service and blood transfusions were administered to the tiny patient.

Today, ten years later, the happy, healthy girl is a fifth grade student at Carson Street school, completely cured.

The family, of normal financial circumstances, were hard hit by the mounting hospital costs. Mr. Morris, a steel mill worker at the time, was asked to pay what he could, but Community Chest came to the rescue, footing the remaining \$1300 hospital bill.

The Morris family, expressing gratitude to the Red Feather agency which gave them back the life of their daughter, regularly send small contributions to the Community Chest.

A bigger "yes" of the forthcoming Community Chest campaign to raise \$10,000,000 in the Los Angeles area means the continuance of its 168 welfare agencies.
