Renegades And Warriors Clash For Homecoming

El Camino college and Bakersfield JC will bang helmets Saturday afternoon at 2 p.m. in the Warriors' annual homecoming football game on the local gridiron.

The Renegades and the Warriors, after last weeks Metro play, find themselves sporting a two win and one loss record, giving them a first place tie with Long Beach, East Los Angeles, and Santa Monica.

Dalnard Paulson, switching from halfback to the quarterback slot, led the Warriors to a smashing 32-6 score over the San Diego Knights at the Balboa stadium Friday night.

Paulson completed 15 of 21 pass attempts good for 202 yards. Ed McFarland and Bill Autrey were Paulson's favorite targets, with McFarland scoring twice on an 18 and 31-yard toss and Autrey gathering in one for 40 markers.

48-Yard Total
Frank Olsen completed two of five for a 48-yard total, one good for 18 yards to end Gary Hunt in the end zone.

All of the Warriors' scoring came on passes as Bob Dehlinger picked off a San Diego pass by Quarterback Joe Duke and ran it back for 24 yards and a TD. Dehlinger, who was switched to the fullback slot after playing halfback throughout the season, spearheaded the Warriors' ground attack.

Saturday night Valley JC pulled another Metro upset when it throttled the Bakersfield attack and beat the Renegades, 13-7. Gene Fitzgerald, who gave the Warriors plenty of trouble in '53 when he made All-Conference, scored the Renegades' only touchdown.

Other members of the 1953 Junior Rose Bowl champions are quarterback T. H. Lockard and fullback Buddy Cuen.
