BALLOT RECOMMENDATIONS

4 OIL AND GAS CONSERVATION. Initiative. Prohibits waste, defined as production methods which reduce maximum economic quantity of oil or gas ultimately recoverable by good engineering practices. Provides for unit operation of pools to increase ultimate recovery on agreement of lessors and lessees of three-fourths of pool. Creates California Oil and Gas Conservation Commission to prevent waste by any necessary or proper orders, including orders limiting production but only to extent necessary to prevent waste. Provides for well spacing. Provides for pooling of spacing units in new pools. Provides Commission's orders shall protect correlative rights. Provides for enforcement and administration. YES X

5 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE ESTABLISHMENTS. Senate Constitutional Amendment No. 2. Eliminates present provision permitting service of intoxicating liquor only in bona fide hotels, restaurants and other public eating places. Authorizes legislation to permit service of alcoholic beverages in public premises in which

room need not be served; restricts presence of minors in such establishments. Incorporates existing ban on service or sale of alcoholic beverages to persons under 21. NO V

6 CHURCH EXEMPTION; PARKING LOTS. Assembly Constitutional Amendment No. 3. Provides that tax exemption for churches shall, until adjacent or non-adjacent property necessarily and reasonably needed for and used exclusively for church parking lot, if such parking lot is required by law and has not been rented or used commercially during preceding year. YES X

7 STATE LEGISLATURE. Assembly Constitutional Amendment No. 68. Changes names of the Assembly of California Legislature to House of Representatives. YES / NO X

8 LEGISLATIVE BUDGET SESSIONS. Senate Constitutional Amendment No. 4. Requires budget session of Legislature to convene in February of each even-numbered year instead of March. After introduction of Budget Bill permits recess of budget session for period up to 30 days. Provides for expenses of committee members considering Budget Bill during such recess. YES X

9 BOROUGH FORM OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT. Assembly Constitutional Amendment No. 46. Authorizes establishment by county charter of a borough form of government either for all or any part of unincorporated territory of county, any such borough to exercise such county powers and be administered as provided by the county charter. YES X

10 STATE CIVIL SERVICE; CONTRACT ARCHITECTS AND ENGINEERS. Senate Constitutional Amendment No. 6. Provides that civil service requirements shall not prevent Legislature from adopting laws permitting State to employ private architects and engineers by contract when work cannot be performed by state agency staff within the required time. YES NO X

11 FRAMING COUNTY CHARTERS. Assembly Constitutional Amendment No. 4. Allows one year, in stead of six months, for preparation of proposed county charter by board of freeholders. YES X

12 STATE INDEBTEDNESS. Senate Constitutional Amendment No. 7. Sets maximum permissible term of statutory state bond issues at 50 instead of 75 years. Declares that full publicity is given to state bond propositions in ballot pamphlets prepared by Secretary of State; eliminates requirement that such propositions be published for three months in newspaper in each county. Authorizes Legislature to reduce authorized bond issue to lesser amount than that fixed by bond proposition. YES NO X

13 REPEALING ALIEN LAND LAW. Repeal of Initiative Act, Submitted by Legislature. Repeals inoperative law of 1920 which formerly denied aliens ineligible to citizenship the right to hold real estate in California. YES NO X

14 LEGISLATIVE EMPLOYEES. Assembly Constitutional Amendment No. 9. Authorizes Legislature to provide for selection of legislative officers, attaches and employees, deleting existing limitations regarding method of hiring and amount of daily payroll during sessions. YES NO X

15 PUBLIC WATER SUPPLIES; MUTUAL WATER COMPANIES. Senate Constitutional Amendment No. 29. Authorizes the State and each political subdivision, district and city to acquire shares of mutual water company stock for the purpose of securing public water supplies. Repeals existing provisions limiting such right to certain public agencies. YES NO X

16 CIVIL AND CRIMINAL APPEALS. Assembly Constitutional Amendment No. 54. Deletes present time limits within which Supreme Court hearing may be ordered after decision by District Court of Appeal. Authorizes Judicial Council to fix such time limits by rule. YES NO X

17 CONSTITUTIONAL PROVISIONS RELATING TO JUDICIARY. Assembly Constitutional Amendment No. 33. Repeals a constitutional provision which formerly regulated salaries of superior court and appellate judges. Repeals another provision dealing with the former Supreme Court Commission. YES NO X

18 INFERIOR COURT JUDGES. Assembly Constitutional Amendment No. 63. Makes judge of a justice court eligible for office as judge of a superseding municipal court established before January 1, 1960, even though he is not an

attorney, where he has served as inferior court judge continuously since November 7, 1945. YES X

19 STATE BOUNDARIES. Senate Constitutional Amendment No. 13. Empowers Legislature to change, alter and redefine California's state boundaries in cooperation with adjoining states and subject to approval of Congress. Authorizes legislation to adjust property taxes as required by such boundary changes. YES NO X

COUNTY QUESTIONS

A COUNTY BOND PROPOSITION A. Bonds for Juvenile Detention and Placement Facilities. Shall the County of Los Angeles incur a bonded indebtedness and issue bonds in the sum of Fifteen Million Four Hundred and Fifty-eight Thousand Dollars (\$15,458,000.00) for the purpose of providing funds for the acquisition of land and the construction of facilities in various parts of the County for the detention training or custodial placement of juveniles, and for uses incidental thereto, including the purchase of equipment therefore? BONDS YES X

B COUNTY BOND PROPOSITION B. Bonds for the Replacement of County Hospital Facilities. Shall the County of Los Angeles incur a bonded indebtedness and issue bonds in the sum of Fifteen Million Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$15,400,000.00) for the purpose of providing funds for the construction of County Hospital facilities containing approximately 700 beds to replace existing County Hospital facilities at Harbor General Hospital, including site clearance and ground improvements therefor and the purchase of equipment from any funds remaining after construction and other costs have been paid? BONDS YES X

C SPECIAL COUNTY PROPOSITION NO. 1. Shall the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles be authorized to adopt the revenue bond method of financing small boat harbor improvements and facilities for public convenience in conjunction therewith, as provided for by Chapter 14 Part 2 Division 2 Title III of the Government Code of the State of California? YES NO X

D PROPOSED COUNTY CHARTER AMENDMENT NO. 1. Shall paragraph 4 of Section 14 of Article IV of the Charter of the County of Los Angeles be amended to separate the offices of Coroner and Public Administrator by eliminating the requirement that the Public Administrator shall be ex officio Coroner, and to also provide that the Coroner shall be a physician who is a certified pathologist?
