It was restored to its original condition, using German parts almost exclusively, it was stated.

WARRIORS EDGE OUT VIKING CREW, 7-6

El Camino college, holding first place in the Metropolitan Conference football race with four wins and one loss, will host the defending champs, Valley J. C., in the Warrior's stadium Saturday night at 8 p.m.

This top-billed Metro game will be the last home clash for Norm Very's blue and gray squad as the Warrior crew will play at Santa Monica next week and then follow with a non-Metro tilt against the Phoenix Bears the day after Thanksgiving.

In a rip-roaring thriller against Long Beach City College Saturday night with first place in the conference at stake, the Caminomen edged out a tough inspired Viking crew, 7-6.

While a near capacity homecoming crowd in the colorful Long Beach Memorial Stadium stood screaming, Viking O'Jay Bourgeois, with just 8 seconds remaining in a hard fought clash, attempted a 45-yard field goal with his team behind, 7-6.

The ball sailed high and true towards the goal post only to hit the cross bar and bounce back. With just a few remaining seconds showing on the clock, Warrior Quarterback Dainard Paulson ran out the clock to end one of the most exciting Metro contests of the season.

The see-saw battle started by giving all indications of a high scoring affair. The Vikings, after losing the ball on an interception, gained it back the same way on the Warriors' 35-yard

line. Then, on the second play from scrimmage, Bourgeois, threw a 65-yard touchdown pass to End Bill Tomasic. The conversion was missed, but the Vikes led 6-0.

The Warriors took the kickoff and ran the ball back to their 38-yard line. A running play gained nothing. Then Paulson duplicated Bourgeois' feat by throwing a 62-yard TD pass to End Bill Autrey.

Dick Dangelo came in and booted what proved to be the winning point.

Although both squads were through scoring for the night, they did make serious threats. Late in the first quarter the Warriors penetrated to the Vikings' 35-yard line, on a series of running plays. A pass from Paulson to Jim Powers moved the pigskin to the Vikes' 11. Another pass attempt in the end zone was intercepted and run back to the 48-yard line.

In the third chapter of the story book thriller, Long Beach moved the ball to the Warriors' 12-yard line and had fourth down and one to go for a first down. Bourgeois had a pass deflected and picked out of the air by Gus Migas who ran it back to the 35-yard line.

Both teams had won five games against one setback for the season and both boasted 3-1 loop marks before going into the Saturday night contest.




