How to Vote Impartially

While this discussion comes too late to benefit voters in the recent election, it is still worth talking about while the experiences of that election are still fresh in the voters' mind.

In bringing this matter up now, the voter will be able to give it serious consideration with an eye toward future elections.

For I know that my proposal would have changed the whole election picture had this revelation descended upon me early enough and had I been able to make it known to the voters of the nation in time.

The one grave concern which occasionally plagues the conscience of every voter is: how can I be sure that I am making the right decision, especially inasmuch as I have no idea what I am voting about.

This holds particularly true in regard to the indecent number of outrageously technical propositions which are presented to the voter as if they were as simple as nursery rhymes.

There is hardly anything to go by in arriving at a proper decision.

In the case of presidential, senatorial and congressional candidates, at least, the basis for judgment is much better: inflamed emotions, glittering generalities, catchy slogans, and artfully concealed prejudices.

My proposal would put elections on a strictly scientific basis, eliminating all possibilities of error resulting from personal bias or lack of information and understanding.

Here's how it would work. Take proposition 4 for instance. On second thought, let's forget it.

Take the presidential candidates instead: Ike and Adlai. Next you take a coin and flip it—heads it's Ike, tails it's Adlai.

Then you go right down the ballot, including the propositions, and do the same thing.

This will guarantee absolute impartiality.

If the coin should land on edge, the vote goes to the Prohibitionists. Thus everyone will have a chance to become president, in the best American tradition.
