 basic wage but has since lowered its demand to \$1.77. The company's best offer has been \$1.749 — leaving a difference of 2.1 cents to be resolved. Union officials maintain that the contract would have been resolved by the November 1 deadline if the company had entered into negotiations with the OCAW officers earlier. That is why the union is asking that any wage agreement be made retroactive to that date. Brymer said that the company's first offer was received by the union just 10 hours before the contract expired at midnight, October 31. About 1400 persons are employed at the local National Supply co., officials stated. About 65 percent of the 1400 employees, which includes office and salaried positions, are represented by the OCAW-CIO. All union members are out on strike, it was reported.

Wins 28-0


