

## JC NEWSPAPER WINS ALL-AMERICA AWARD

Receipt of its sixth consecutive All-American rating among junior colleges throughout the nation was announced recently by the Warhoop, weekly newspaper at El Camino college, in its tenth year of publication.

The award, which follows a series of evaluations of all phases of newspaper content and make-up, was presented by the Associated Collegiate Press, at the University of Minnesota for the spring semester, 1956. The Warhoop received ex-

cellent ratings in news sources, page balance, style, story leads, sports writing and display, headlines and typography. Superior ratings were given in first page display and editorial page make-up.

Heading the Warhoop staff during the semester was editor-in-chief Dick Baylor, assisted by news editor Claudia Larsen, feature editor Max Shapiro, associate news editor, J. P. vanEttinger and sports editor, Lyndell Manley.

Reporters during the spring semester were Virginia Hughey, Carolyn Denmark, Theima Smith, Bob Wilson, Tom Cum-

mins, Steve Leacher, Ken Hackney, Bill Godfrey, Denise Funk and Bill Wilson.

Other staff members were ad manager Clark MacGillivray, business manager Pat Mullican and photographers Julius Gray and Glen Goodwin.

Among returnees who are serving on the present Warhoop staff is vanEttinger who has assumed the dual role of student commissioner of college publications and associate news editor. Shapiro, who will transfer to San Jose State College next semester, is the present editor-in-chief.

Also transferring to San Jose State this spring is Godfrey, who has served both as news editor and reporter during the current semester at El Camino. Leacher has held two editorial posts this semester, working first as sports editor, later as news editor. Miss Funk has alternated a feature page editor and a reporter.

Newcomers to the staff this semester are Louis Margadonna, current feature editor; Mike Blum, present sports editor; Mrs. Olivia Diaz, business manager, and reporters Gene Gillette, Don Bishop, Jim Brooks, and Bob Crowe. W. A. Kamrath is the faculty advisor.




