'All-America' Festivities Slated For January 25, 26

Plans have been completed for the gigantic "All-America Cities" celebration January 25 and 26, it was announced today by General Chairman Doug Horlander. Horlander stated the first event will be held at Torrance High school on January 25 at 9:30 a.m. where Dr. J. H. Hull and Mayor Albert Isen will present duplicates of the official "All-America City" flag to representatives of each Torrance public and parochial school. Following this general assembly there will be additional presentations at each school later in the day.

A mobile parade will start at 1 p.m. Saturday, January 26, at the corner of Maple and Torrance blvd., and will cover the

entire Torrance area with sirens, whistles, etc. All organizations in the community have been asked to enter decorated moving vehicles in the parade which will conclude at 2:30 p.m. at the civic center.

The recently completed civic center will be open for public inspection tours from 1 to 3 p.m. All citizens are strongly urged to take this opportunity to acquaint themselves with city operation.

At 3 p.m. the Torrance Youth band and musical organizations from both Torrance and North Torrance High schools will appear at the civic center led by a posse from the Torrance Mounted police. A brief presentation ceremony highlighted by the awarding and raising of the official "All-America City" flag will begin shortly after 3 p.m. All citizens are urged to attend this ceremony which will be attended by Attorney General Edmund Brown, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn, State Senator Richard Richards, Frank Vanderlip Jr., of the National Municipal league and other civic and governmental leaders from all over California.

At 4 p.m., a reception will be held for out of town guests by invitation only.

The official "All-America" Award presentation will be made at the banquet starting at 6:30 p.m. in the Torrance Municipal auditorium. Horlander stated that this affair would be most colorful and stirring and urged that citizens secure tickets soon at the Torrance Chamber of Commerce office.

At last report there are still a few tickets remaining although the sales have been heavy. Due to restrictions holding the attendance to 500 at the banquet the "All-America City" celebration committee, composed of civic leaders from community organizations, have scheduled a free dance to be held in the Torrance American Legion hall, 1109 Border ave., starting at 9 p.m., on the 26. A top orchestra has been secured for this portion of the celebration.

Chamber of Commerce officials report that all of the 30,000 window stickers have been distributed through co-operation of the school system but that there remain a few 6"x6" decals that may be obtained at the Chamber office.
