'All-America' City Honors Aired by Isen

In connection with the "All-America City" award, Mayor Albert Isen addressed the Soroptimists at their regular luncheon meeting, Monday, January 21.

"It has been the biggest thrill of my life to serve as mayor and councilman in Torrance and one of my greatest experiences to present our case before the judges in Memphis, Tenn," he said.

One of Three
Speaking on, "Torrance, the All-America City," the mayor pointed out that only three cities out of the final eleven were picked for top coverage in Look magazine. Torrance was chosen because it was representative of cities that have "kept pace in government through citizen participation in an orderly manner."

Torrance was selected by the National Municipal League for the honor not because "our story is sensational, but for three rather distinct reasons: 1. energetic, intelligent citizen action, 2. city school cooperation, and 3. City-manager, city-council government at its best."

No Crime, Vice
Isen stated that the city has had no organized crime or vice and that the bid for the honor was based on "citizen action and ability to cope intelligently with our growth problems."

In September, 1947, there were only 4 city schools; in October, 1956, the total had increased to 18 with 5 schools under construction.

The mayor also gave the same ten minute presentation

that he gave before the judges, tracing the growth of Torrance from 1913, when the city was created, with 300 population, to the present.

After the city was founded, industries such as glass, rubber, aircraft, started moving in and 7 years later the city was incorporated with a population of 1200. The growth from that point on increased rapidly but the most significant population was made after the city manager system went into effect in 1948. The jump was from 13,000 in 1948 to the present 82,238 as determined by the official census in October, 1956.
