## Manhattan Players

### LITTLE THEATRE MARKS FIFTIETH PRODUCTION

Dazzling eyes and a sparkling personality walked off with top honors when Bernice McMahon played the part of the talkative Mrs. Partridge in the Manhattan Players 50th production, "Solid Gold Cadillac," which closed last weekend.

#### Gains Control

Bernice won the hearts of everyone as she proceeded to outsmart and out-talk her business "associates" until she finally gained control of the General Products corp. Her impressive background includes directing and acting with the Davenport players in Iowa where she majored in dramatic arts. She has also written one-act plays for radio and the stage and won best bit actress award last year for role in "Picnic," and best supporting actress award in the Santa Monica tournament.

The "four ugly men" as the business men were termed by narrator Al Schneider, were well cast in their greedy roles. They were Denton Wable, Carl Rogers, Charles Brannen and Irwin Blumenthal. Blumenthal mastered the rapid-tongued, nervous part of the treasurer to almost unbelievable (could he do it?) while Schneider narrated every scene with a deft Brooklyn accent.

Dick Miller, who will be remembered for his role of "Doc" in the Player production, "Come Back Little Sheba," gave excellent direction to the fast moving comedy in his first directing assignment for the Players. He has directed the Ben Bard players and has had extensive acting experience in Little Theatre.

#### 'Noble Romans'

Miller's directing talents and George Devenny's acting talents were skillfully blended in the first act when Devenny, who played the part of the company's founder, Edward L. McKeever, gave a vivid recitation for Mrs. Partridge's benefit on ancient Roman battle tactics.

The well-received monologue was one of the highlights of the play handled adroitly by veteran actor Devenny who has acted in 52 theatres throughout the country. His wealth of experience as an actor, (summer stock in New York, St. Louis Community playhouse, Santa Monica Theatre guild), director and teacher are reflected in "Cadillac," his first experience with the Players.

News real round-ups in movie form were also part of the action. Harper Roisman, who has been with the Players for many seasons, was Edward R. Burroughs, midnight news commentator. This entertaining sequence was filmed in Mayor Albert Isen's office as a satire on that familiar TV figure—complete with leather back chair and an overdose of cigarettes.

#### Hedda?

Harper's wife, Junne, gave the woman's side of the news in a big hat and big smile. She has been with the players since 1947 and just finished the lead in "Sheba." Both gave extremely clever commentaries on the latest developments.

Others in the cast included Carol Schappert, Bruce Wilson, Helen Welge, Bill Kraemer, Bill Walker, Bud Wells, Bob Nelson, Miriam Wilson as Miss L'Arriere (derriere?), and Dorothy Bushell, a little old lady, who could easily have started the whole thing over again had it not been for Miss Partridge's final, "The meeting is adjourned."—D. P.
