MARKET MERGER WILL TAKE PLACE MARCH 4

The merger of two of California's leading independent supermarket organizations will be consummated March 4, according to Theodore Cummings, president of Cummings Markets, Inc. The merging companies are Cummings Markets, Inc., which operates four Food Giant markets, in Lynwood, Inglewood, Hawthorne, and Whittier, and the partnership of Weisstein and Cummings, which operates Toluca Mart, in Burbank and the Food King market in Canoga Park.

The corporate name of the newly merged organizations will be Food Giant markets, with Cummings as president, and Nat Cummings, and Nathan Weisstein in executive capacities. According to Cummings all personnel of the two existing companies will be absorbed into the new company, and the two companies' previous policy of flexibility of merchandising at the store level will be continued.

Cummings stated that the new merger will serve as the foundation for a program of expansion which is to be accomplished by the building of new units and the acquiring of existing supermarkets both in and out of the state of California.

At present, Food Giant markets plans to complete three 40,000 square foot stores in Santa Ana, Torrance, and Kellogg Park this year.
