Expansion of Consciousness Called Key to Evolution

The experience of soul-consciousness, that state of total self-awareness which has been known in the past by relatively few individuals as divine identification, can become in our time a condition of awareness shared by mass humanity. "Man is very much more than he ordinarily supposes himself to be," said Mr. Simcoe. "He lives in a very minute fragment of himself, and has become identified with the fragment. Wisdom is the process whereby true identity is recovered. We offer simple techniques for establishing a practical working relationship between Soul and personality." Mr. Simcoe is 42, married, lives at 2917 Eldorado st. In 1949 he was presented with an honorary membership in the Self-Realization Fellowship by its late founder.

A testimonial banquet, honoring James A. Evans, 76, for his 45 years of active membership in the Loyal Order of Moose, and his work in behalf of the thousands of orphans who have graduated from Mooseheart, will be held at the Torrance Moose Lodge, 1744 W. Carson st., on Sunday, March 17, at 5 p.m., Joseph Platt, civic affairs chairman, announced today.

Evans, a retired Torrance businessman, has been secretary of the Torrance Moose Lodge No. 785 since 1949. He joined the fraternity in 1912, just one year before the multi-million dollar philanthropic project known as the Moose Child City was founded near Chicago, and has held continuous membership since that date.

Evans, his wife Martha, and his two sons, came to Torrance 21 years ago. Since that time the Moose secretary has taken an active behind-the-scenes interest in community affairs. He has, however, served as vice-president of the Local 1414 of the Steel Workers' Union.
