

EC Physics Professor To Head Summer Institute

New honors to Julius Sumner Miller were noted this week when the El Camino college instructor of physics was named head of the summer session institute program in physics at the University of California at Los Angeles. The program is under the sponsorship of the National Science Foundation.

Designed to meet the needs of high school teachers in the fields of math and science, the institute program will provide special attention to course content in the fields of chemistry, life sciences, mathematics, and physics. Modern developments in each scientific field will be discussed, Miller stated.

The El Camino instructor will be assisted in the presentation of the physics course by two other instructors. Miller's course is called Demonstration of Fundamental Principles of Physics: Frontiers of Physics, and will be presented in the form of a demonstration laboratory.

Enrollment in each area of the institute will be limited to 25. Financial assistance will be provided teachers accepted for instruction in the course with a basic stipend of \$450 given for the six weeks and \$90 for each dependent and travel allowances being added to this sum. Summer session fees will be paid each recipient of a stipend award, the university indicated.

Application blanks for interested teachers are available from the Summer Sessions Office of the university.

To support the program di-

rected by the El Camino instructor, the National Science Foundation has appropriated a sum of \$100,000 of which each of the four fields in the program will receive \$25,000.


Dream Come True Demonstrating the interest which teachers have taken in Miller's "dream of 20 years come true," is the fact that more than 500 inquiries for enrollment in the program were received even prior to the official announcement that it would be included in the summer session at UCLA.

Lectures in Miller's course will be built around demonstration experiments, with teachers enrolled building equipment for use in actual classroom situations.

The physics instructor's objectives in the program are to improve the teaching of physics on all levels and to arouse and awaken interest in physics by means of stimulating demonstrations.

Now in his fourth year at El Camino, the former student with Einstein has taught physics at UCLA for the past 10 summers as a visiting professor. He now has a research appointment at the university where he is giving time in preparation of the summer program aided by two assistants and a shop mechanician.

Honored in the 9th edition of American Men of Science, Miller holds the rank of Associate Research Physicist at UCLA.


