flowers and the art of flower arrangement to participate in the show. Since the last day of the flower show falls on Mother's Day, the Greenthumbers

suggest that the whole family accompany mother and try her to the colorful spectacle. The following rules will govern the show:

1. Cut flowers and specimen blooms must be grown by exhibitor. Flowers for floral arrangements need not be grown by exhibitor.
 2. No artificial flowers.
 3. The committee will not be responsible for loss or damage to materials or containers.
 4. First, second, and third place ribbons will be awarded under each classification.
 5. Trophies will be awarded.
 6. Floor displays and potted plants must be entered between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m., Friday, May 10.
 7. Cut flowers, floral arrangements and specimen blooms may be entered Friday evening or Saturday between 8 and 10 a.m., May 11.
 8. The exhibit will be open to the public from 3 p.m. to 9 p.m. on May 11 and from 11 to 5 on May 12.
 9. Removal of entries, Sunday, May 12, from 6 to 7.
 10. Any meritorious exhibit not provided for in the schedule will be suitably recognized.
 11. Name specimen blooms and potted plants.
 12. No more than one entry in each class.
- Classifications will be: Floral Arrangements, Cut Flowers, Club Entries, Potted Plants, Garden Arrangements, Children's Arrangements, Commercial Arrangements, Specimen Blooms, Floor Displays and Wedding Arrangements, commercial or amateur.
