### Career Guidance Program Set Up For Seniors

More than 400 high school seniors will be interviewed by business and industrial leaders by the end of this week under a career guidance program sponsored by the Torrance Unified School district and the Chamber of Commerce.

The vocational guidance committee of the Torrance Kiwanis club is assisting in the two-week program.

Senior students of both Torrance and North high schools indicated their choice of profession on form cards which were processed by the Chamber of Commerce staff to coordinate the schedule of interviews.

Planning the program were: Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent of schools; Lysle Albro, work experience coordinator for the school system; Carl Ahee, Torrance high principal; Dale Harter, North high principal; and Dr. Bruce Magner, principal of South high school now under construction.

Dick Fitzgerald, Chamber of Commerce manager, and H. C. Barrington, Les King and Von Bergen of the Kiwanis club, aided the educators in setting up the program.

### Park, Recreation Commissioners Air Problems At Area Meeting

Approximately 100 Parks and Recreation Commissioners from the southwest area of Los Angeles County held a dinner meeting Wednesday, April 24, to discuss the recreation picture as it exists in California today, and to see if there isn't an answer to the problem of providing recreation for the citizens of this mushrooming area.

Commissioners on the panel, "The Commissioners Speak," were Jack Kirkpatrick of Hawthorne, Jack Hapke of El Segundo, Mrs. Malvina Gray of Gardena, G. Donovan of Redondo Beach, and Mrs. Herma Tillim of Torrance. Also on the panel was Mrs. Alys Drobnick, recently elected to the City Council in Santa Monica.

Among the conclusions reached on the many items discussed were: the importance of co-operation between schools and city in providing community recreation; wasteful use of limited money for facilities and personnel was dramatically presented when one commissioner stated that on one hand you will see school playgrounds fenced and closed, with no leadership, and on the other hand you will see recreation facilities with too many leaders and no children participants.

On the subject of bond issues, it was felt that commissioners must give much thought to how bond issues are presented, and when they are presented.

Some favored special elections held at a time when there would be little or no conflict

with local politics involving candidates seeking office. On the other hand, a number of the commissioners felt that it was a waste of money to call for special elections.

Apparently, the commissioners felt that timing of the bond issue was sufficiently important that it made little difference whether it was made at a time of a general election or at a time when a special election was called.

Commissioners felt that they should not only represent the tax payers by striving to economize and hold down the tax rate for recreation, but also helping to establish recreation policies, assist the director in every way possible without actually interfering in the program itself, and act as a liaison between people of the community, the director, and the City Council.
