**GALS DO BACKSTAGE WORK WHILE MEN ACT**

One of the unusual features of Accent Theatre's current all-male production, "Stalag 17," is the all female crew headed by Barbara "Bobby" Cooper, stage manager.

A usual production evening finds Bobby two hours before curtain time setting up the stage and checking props (water in pots, cleaning out cups, checking all the bunks) with Judy Sagenkahn who is in charge of properties.

This includes scurrying around to find the lost socks, drawers, tee shirts and other intimate items of male apparel which have been misplaced since the previous performance. Multiply by 18 the average housewife's problem with her husband's sloppy undressing habits and it equals what Bobby goes through at this point.

Makeup is handled by Pat Gray and Dotty Blais.

**Jangled Nerves**  
As curtain time approaches, a series of crises are met and overcome with jangled nerves and pre-curtain jitters mounting. Finally curtain time; frantic signals are passed between the light and sound booth at the rear of the auditorium and the backstage area by Patricia Cattle on sound and Molly Stolle, lights.

According to Bobby, the blackout system used for scene changes presents a problem in precision timing that would tax the capacity of an electronic computer.

**Cacophony of Sounds**  
The climax of the play, technically speaking, is in the final scene when barking dogs, fires, whistles, offstage voices and machine gun bullets are synchronized with the activity on stage to create the dramatic conclusion.

**Forgery Pair Arraignment Set May 22**

Lewis Kemp Carrel, 27, and John J. Akers, 19, picked up April 25 by Inglewood police for passing some \$2600 in bad checks in the San Gabriel Valley area, had their preliminary hearing Friday, May 3, in Pasadena.

Both will be held to answer May 22 in superior court at the time of their arraignment. Carrel is out on \$1500 bail and Akers, who allegedly passed the checks written by Carrel, is still being held in the Pasadena jail. He was originally picked up in Arcadia.

Carrel, 21505 Ocean ave., Torrance, was a sixth grade teacher at a WALTERIA elementary school at the time of his arrest. He was hired last November and according to acting superintendent of schools Albert N. Posner, he had no previous police record.

**Paving Work Contract is Announced**

Contract for the improvement of 208th st. from Western ave. to Harvard ave., including paving of the north side of the street and sidewalks on both sides, has been awarded, it is announced by Council President John S. Gibson.

Flippen Bros. Construction co. drew the award on its low bid. Work already is underway on the construction of a sanitary sewer line on 208th from Harvard ave. to Denker st. This block also is to be paved and improved with walks.

Petition for the construction of curbs, gutters and walks on 207th st. between Harvard and Denker has been filed, Councilman Gibson said, and names are being checked. A petition also has been filed with the city for the paving of the east side of Denker ave. from Torrance Blvd. to 209th st. A sanitary sewer line and sidewalks are included in the improvement.

Interested property owners now are canvassing the neighborhood seeking petitions for the complete improvement of the entire area between 205th st. and Torrance Blvd. and from Western ave. to and including Denker ave.

**Polynesian Restaurant Construction Begins**

Plans for one of the Southland's most modern restaurants were announced today by Manager L. P. Reitz, Jr. The new "Polynesian," a South Seas specialty restaurant will be located at 3901 Pacific Coast Hwy. in the WALTERIA District of Torrance, at the foot of Palos Verdes hills.

**Two Acres**  
The complete installation, hoisted on two acres of land, will involve an investment of \$400,000. The buildings are designed by the architectural firm of Renfro and George, AIA, with the construction contract awarded to Harold G. Drews, Palos Verdes Estates. Land lease was arranged through Champion, Armont, and Howard of Hollywood Riviera.

Ground was broken at special ceremonies Monday, May 6, to insure opening for the fall season. Guests at the "ground-breaking" included Mayor Albert Isen of Torrance, Torrance Chamber of Commerce President A. E. Thompson, Gaye Wilson as "Miss Torrance," plus the officials of the corporation.

**Outdoor "Luau"**  
Over 200 people can be served at one setting and a private dining room accommodates up to 100 people. An outdoor "Luau" area, authentically landscaped and dressed in South Sea motif will provide for private parties of up to 800 people.

The interior plan will depict a Polynesian village, with a replica of a Samoan hut serving as the cocktail lounge. Complete Cantonese and South Sea Island fare will be offered, in addition to steaks and other entrees from the charcoal broiler.
