

## Register for Anza School Kindergarten

"Spring Round Up" of kindergarten children for next September will take place at the Anza Elementary school on May 21 and 22, according to R. Carl Shaner, principal. Children must be 5 years old on or before December 2, 1957 in order to be enrolled this coming September. In registering children, parents should bring a birth certificate, baptismal record or other suitable document in order to verify their child's age. On these two registration days, kindergarten teachers, and the school nurse will be available to answer questions, and the school doctor will examine the prospective kindergartners. Appointments for the physical examinations can be obtained from Mrs. Lupin, the school clerk. Parents may also request enrollment forms by telephone. These will be mailed so parents can complete them before coming to school.


