

Favorable Action On Mental Health Bill Aids Local Clinic

Through the Legislature's favorable passage of the Community Mental Health Services Bill, to be known as the Short-Doyle Act, communities in Los Angeles county are now enabled to double mental health services without spending an extra cent. This information was disclosed to a meeting of the Mental Health Committee of the Los Angeles Area Regional Welfare Planning Council by Dr. Portia Hume, deputy director of the State Department of Mental Hygiene.

Speaking before members and guests assembled at Queen of Angels Hospital, Dr. Hume explained that it is now possible for the state to match funds with county and city governing bodies for the operation of local mental health programs.

At present, she said, Los Angeles county is estimated to spend \$600,000 annually on such services. Through the new law, matching dollar for dollar, the figure could be expanded to \$1,200,000 a year without costing

Los Angeles a penny. In introducing Dr. Hume, the chairman, Superior Judge J. Howard Ziemann, stated "more was accomplished for mental health programs by the State legislature this year than ever before in the entire nation."

Reese Swaim, newly appointed executive director of the Harbor Area Welfare Planning Council attended the meeting

with Mrs. Clarke E. Walsworth, coordinator of the Harbor District Mental Health Service.

Step Forward
"There was a discouraging loss of similar legislation two years ago," states Mrs. Walsworth. When we compare the unanimous passage of this legislation without a dissenting vote by the Assembly in our committee (Social Welfare or Ways and Means) or floor hearings (4), we must pay a tribute to the many citizens and organizations of our area who have worked for four long years to work expansion of our local mental health service in the Palos Verdes, San Pedro, South Bay, Torrance area," she stated.

Local Clinic
Local interest and efforts have been channeled through the Harbor District Mental Health Ser-

vice which pioneered with the State Department of Mental Hygiene and the Los Angeles City Health Department in the establishment of the first "all-purpose pilot clinic" (now officially known as the San Pedro Mental Hygiene Clinic) as an integral part of a Community Mental Health Service program in California.

The pioneer endeavor helped demonstrate the "feasibility of cooperative state and local effort" and thus furnished part of the working basis for the newly passed legislation.

"In this way," Mrs. Walsworth said, "our local communities cooperating through their representative body, the Harbor District Mental Health Service have made a major contribution to the welfare history of Cal-
