

"The Strength of PTA — Vision, Courage, Action Equals Our Children." This is the theme taken by the Walteria PTA for the year of '57-58.


Working with this thought in mind, the program committee held a meeting at the home of Mrs. Henry Fink Jr. to plan the programs for the year.
