


**TORRANCE Y-WIVES**




VON'S NEW GENERAL OFFICE BUILDING

**Planning Commission News Briefs**

**FENCES, WALLS, HEDGES:**

An ordinance calling for six-foot barriers in back yards and 36-inch high protection in front yards was recommended for approval.

**PARKING:** A land use ordinance providing that no more than 50 per cent of business property could be used for buildings to insure adequate parking was received favorably.

**TRAILERS:** A new trailer ordinance is being studied which would prevent the parking of trailers on front setbacks for

more than 48 hours on the side setbacks of corner lots.

**NOTICES:** Under study is an amendment to the zoning ordinance which would call for notices to be posted in the neighborhood of a proposed zone or variance request instead of the present method whereby residents within 300 feet are notified individually by mail.

**LOT SPLITS:** The first hearing on lot splits in the South Torrance oil fields will be held August 7.

**MEDICAL CLINIC:** Held over until detailed plot plans are presented was a request for approval of a medical clinic building at 4060 W. 226th st. presented by Max E. and Frances Webber of Palos Verdes.

**APARTMENTS:** Held over until the next meeting was a request of Claude G. Jarrett, Los Angeles, for a variance to build a home and eight apartments on Newton st. between Ocean and Los Codonas.

**ZONE CHANGES:** First hearings on a request for zone change from A-1 to R-1 on property located between 180th and 182nd st. and Gramercy and Arlington was set for August 7.

**EDISON CO.:** Hearing on Edison co.'s request for variance to enlarge the present substation on Madrid ave. between Torrance Blvd. and Eldorado was set for August 7.
