

Hancock Service Station Holds Grand Opening Here

Grand opening celebrations, including gifts and prizes, will be held this week-end, Thursday through Sunday, at the Hancock Service station, 213th st. and Western ave.

The new station, owned and operated by Robert A. (Bob) Owens, will give away 100, 75, and 25 gallons of gasoline; a 14" Hoffman portable TV set; clock radio; 10 lubrications; 10 wheel rotations; and 10 brake adjustments.

There will be free gifts for the youngsters and customers.

Included among services offered are washing, greasing, brake adjustment, wheel alignment, Firestone tires, and free pick and delivery service.

No Burning After October Warns L A Health Officer

Dr. Roy O. Gilbert, Los Angeles County Health Officer, today warned householders in the unincorporated areas of the County that it is their individual responsibility to make pick-up arrangements for refuse before the October 1 deadline on burning.

The only exception to such arrangements in unincorporated areas are those householders who live within a garbage disposal district. In such districts

the County supplies pick-up service through contracts with collectors and the cost of such service is added to the householders property tax.

Along with his warning that the October 1 ban on burning will be strictly enforced, the Health Officer outlined the following provisions of the County Ordinance which he is charged to enforce in the unincorporated territory.

Garbage trucks will be required to have water-tight metal tanks and covers, and the contractors' names and phone numbers must appear in three inch print on both sides of all trucks and trailers. All equipment must be kept clean, in good repair and well painted.

It is also required that each contractor maintain an office to be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. except Sundays and holidays, where toll-free telephone service will be available to customers registering complaints or

seeking information.

Garbage collection must be made at least twice a week and combustible and non-combustible rubbish once a week. The collector will be required to pick up unlimited amounts of each. No collections will be allowed between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. unless granted by the Health Officer in order to cope with an emergency.

Collectors will not be allowed to refuse service to any dwelling which is reasonably adjacent to the areas they serve.

Collectors are required to file with the Health Officer information concerning areas served, rates charged, business name, address and telephone numbers and any changes pertaining thereto.

Dr. Gilbert said that this program will require the services of about 100 private collectors who will be given a one year trial period to demonstrate whether or not they can provide an effective and economical service to County residents.

He said that persons living in incorporated cities should contact their city officials pertaining to collection of their rubbish.


